**PROPOSED BASELINE FILING SCHEDULE AND REQUEST FOR
CLARIFICATION OF THE ELECTRIC POWER SUPPLY ASSOCIATION**

Attached please find the Electric Power Supply Association's (EPSA)¹ proposed baseline filing schedule, submitted on behalf of the EPSA members listed in the schedule. The proposed schedule responds to the above-referenced notice issued by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or the Commission) on December 1, 2009, and published at 74 Fed. Reg. 65,114 on December 9, 2009. EPSA respectfully requests that the Commission approve the schedule on behalf of the participating EPSA members.

Companies not listed on the attached schedule have indicated that either FERC may assign them a month in which to file or they do not have any tariffs on file with the Commission that are applicable. There are no companies on the EPSA schedule filing in April 2010. However, there are EPSA members on the Edison Electric Institute (EEI) schedule filing in April;² further, members not listed on EPSA's schedule have indicated that they will be ready to file in any of the six transitional months.

¹ EPSA is the national trade association representing competitive power suppliers, including generators and marketers. These suppliers, who account for 40 percent of the installed generating capacity in the United States, provide reliable and competitively priced electricity from environmentally responsible facilities serving global power markets. EPSA seeks to bring the benefits of competition to all power customers.

² Some companies are on both EEI and EPSA's list. Some companies have opted not to be on EPSA's list because they are already reflected on EEI's.

The EPSA schedule does not list the number of tariffs each company will file and does not go into detail on how many tariffs or on which assets each company needs to file. As most companies have multiple tariffs to file, EPSA respectfully requests that the Commission clarify that companies are allowed to file multiple tariffs throughout the month indicated rather than filing all necessary tariffs on the first of that month.
